

GUIDE TO NAECI REGISTRATION CATEGORY 1 AND 2

Introduction

All current Category 1 projects and Category 2 R&M sites are NAECI Registered. New projects and R&M sites also require registration. The means to this rests with the parties to the SPA during negotiation. NJC Approval of the SPA automatically registers the project or site and enables its listing on the NJC Web Site.

The process of NAECI registration both formalises and strengthens the use of the NAECI and ensures that its benefits are delivered in full for both the employers and employees of the signatory employers' associations and trade unions respectively bringing efficient and effective delivery to Clients.

Registration

Registered NAECI In-scope work will bring the following benefits:

- NJC approval to use NAECI on Registered work
- Visibility and monitoring of construction activity
- Common employment standards
- Employee engagement and good industrial relations
- Encouragement of good safety practices
- Promotion and support of Assuring Competence in Engineering Construction (ACE)
- Full access to the NAECI procedures
- NJC Regional Operations Manager support
- By agreement with HMRC, tax dispensation on travel and accommodation

Who can apply for Registration?

Clients in the first instance can initiate registration directly with the NJC or through their EPC or Managing Contractor. NAECI Signatory Employers' Association members (SELECT and TICA members, see note) as managing contractors, main contractors and contractors, singularly or as a group, engaged or about to be engaged on in-scope activities as defined in NAECI 1.3 must apply to have the work "NAECI Registered".

Application Process

The application process for NAECI Registration is intended to be simple and efficient whilst ensuring that all necessary information is made available to the NJC to allow a decision on the application to be made.

All current Categorised projects including R&M sites will automatically be registered by virtue of their existing NJC approved Supplementary Agreements or local agreement.

Future Category 1 and Category 2 projects will also be automatically registered and approved from the outset as part of the Supplementary Agreement development and NJC approval process.

SELECT and TICA members will continue to operate in accordance with the provisions of NAECI 1.7.3 and NAECI 1.7.1 respectively. Registration of work for SELECT and TICA members, therefore, relates to Category 1 New Construction Projects and those sites where it is agreed that the provisions of the NAECI will apply (e.g. Category 2: Long Term Repair and Maintenance).

All other electrical work in Scotland and other thermal insulation work will continue to be paid in accordance with the SJIB National Working Rules and the National Agreement for Thermal Insulation Contracting Industry as appropriate.
